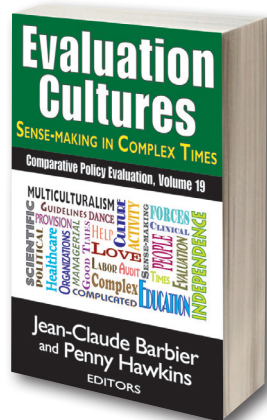


ABOUT THE SERIES EDITOR

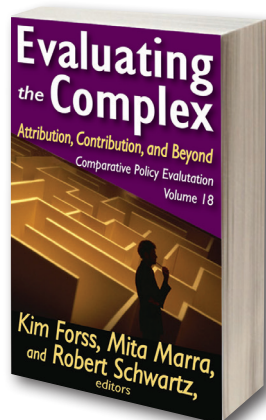
